 Munich Airport “Franz-Joseph-Strauss”
 Transfer to the city by suburban train S1, S8 (travel time approx. 40 minutes); airport bus to main train station (travel time approx. 45 minutes); taxi

By train

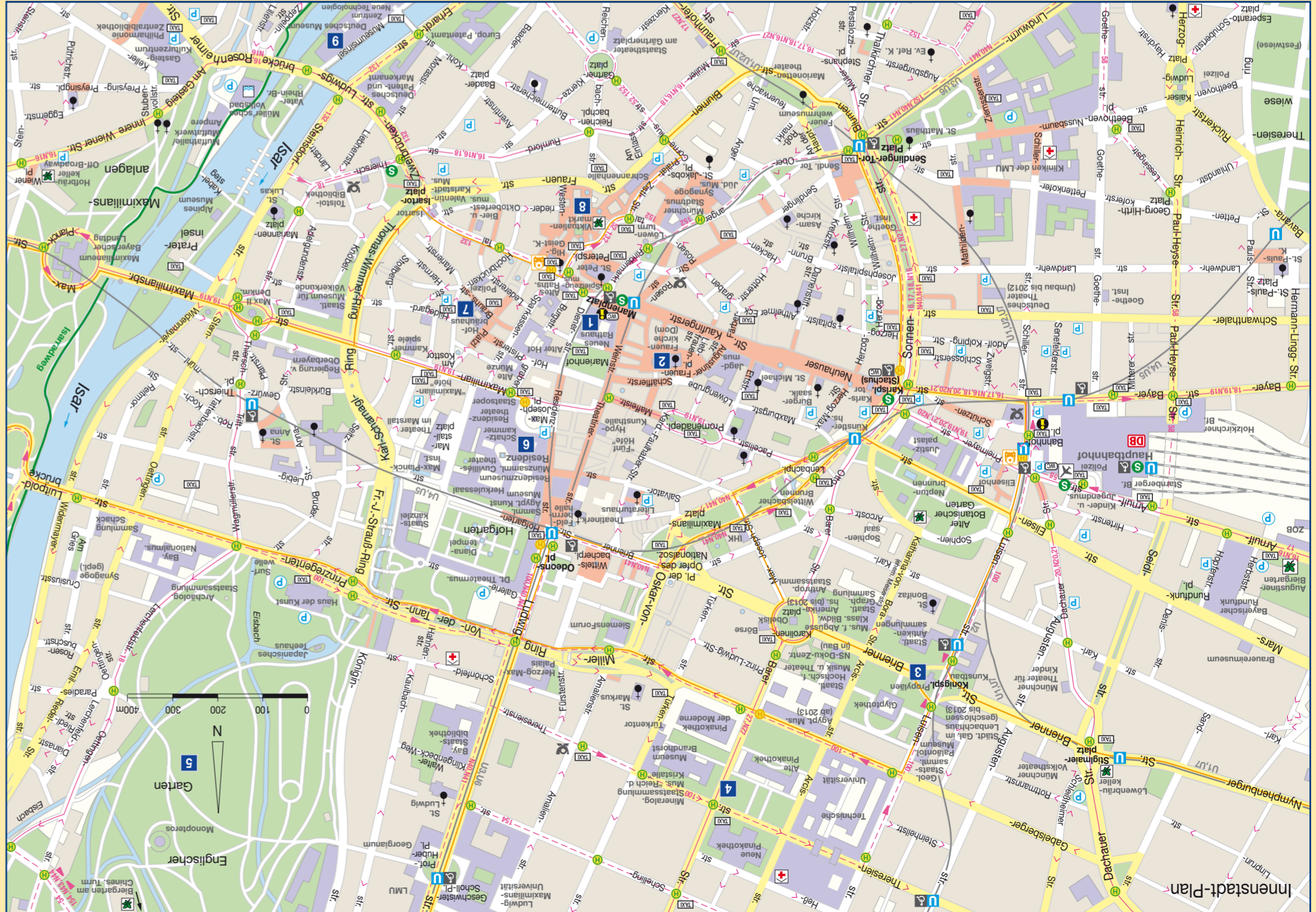
Holidays
 New Year's Day (January 1); Epiphany (January 6); Good Friday, Easter Sunday and Monday; May Day (May 1); Ascension Day; Pentecost Sunday and Monday; Corpus Christi; Assumption Day (August 15); Day of German Unity (October 3); All Saints' Day (November 1); Christmas Days (December 25&26)

Business Hours

City Map



1 Marienplatz Square with Townhall and Carillon
 Marienplatz square is the center and the heart of the city. The famous carillon in the tower of the New Townhall resounds at 11 a.m. and at noon (in summer also at 5 p.m.).

2 Frauentirche (Church of Our Lady)
 The Gothic cathedral and its municipal parish church with its ornion-spired towers is Munich's most remarkable landmark.

3 Königsplatz Square
 The Königsplatz square forms an integral part of the overall ensemble of Breiten Strasse. Munich's first spanned boulevard. The square is flanked by important museums of the city (Glyptothek, Collection of Antiquas).

4 Museumsareal/Pinakotheken
 Within this area four prime art galleries can be visited: Alte Pinakothek (18th-19th centuries), Neue Pinakothek (18th and 19th centuries), Pinakothek der Moderne (20th and 21st centuries) and Museum Brandhorst (collection of art from the 20th/21st centuries).

5 English Garden
 The English Garden extends over 373 ha (922 acres) and is one of the largest urban parks in the world. Numerous bike and hiking trails, typic books and several beer gardens turn the park into an attraction for all seasons.

6 Royal Residence and Opera
 The Munich Residence, the largest residential palace in Germany, was the seat of the Bavarian rulers for more than 400 years. Today its art collections present an eminent example of courtly culture in Europe. The Bavarian State Opera is located right next to the palace.

7 Hofbräuhaus
 The Hofbräuhaus – a traditional inn in the center of town is equally popular with locals and guests from all over the world who mingle in its self-service area (Schwenkmei), restaurant, beer garden and during a Bavarian evening.

8 Viktualienmarkt
 The Viktualienmarkt is the bustling shopping market for gourmets and popular beer garden in the heart of the city.

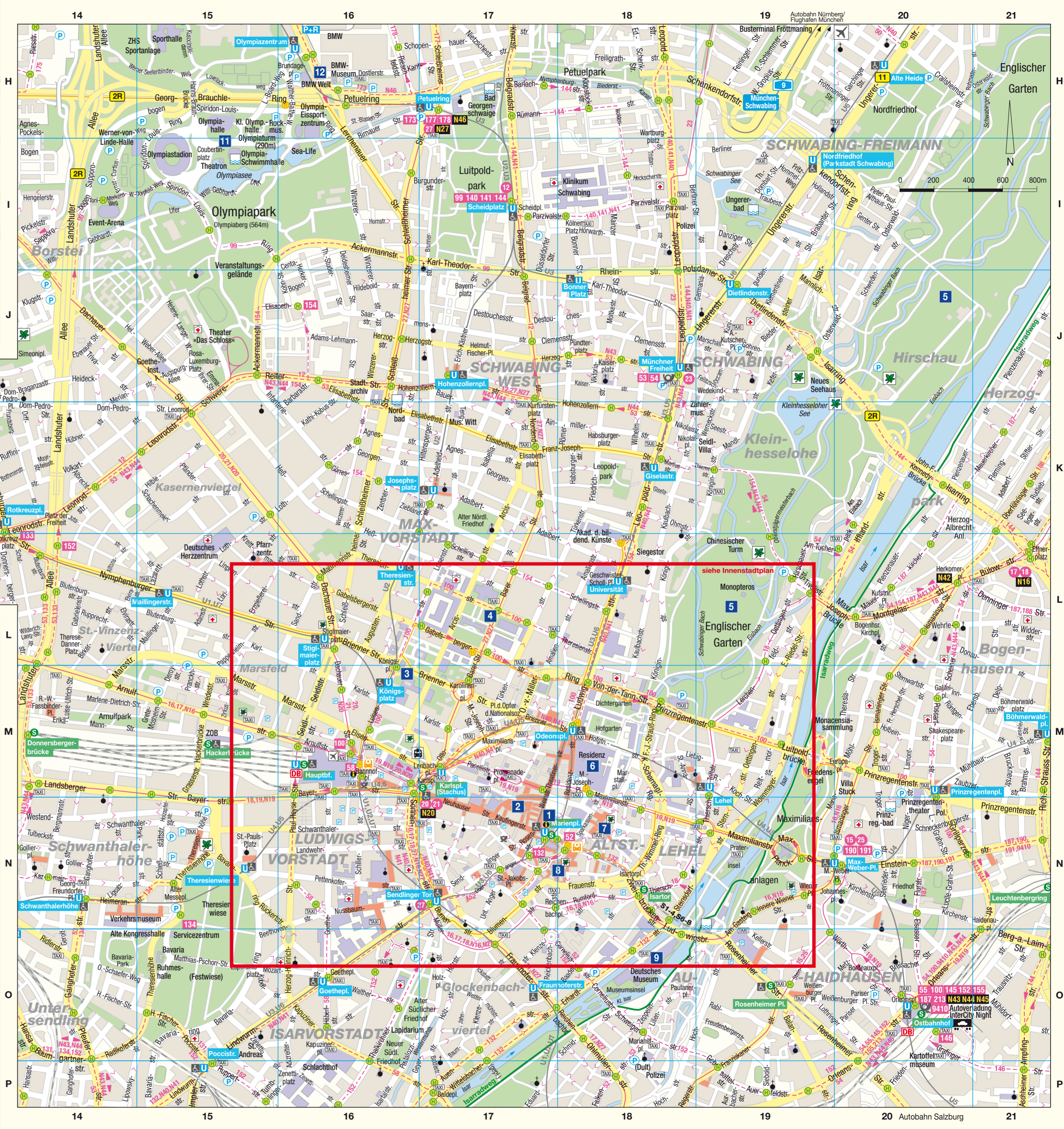
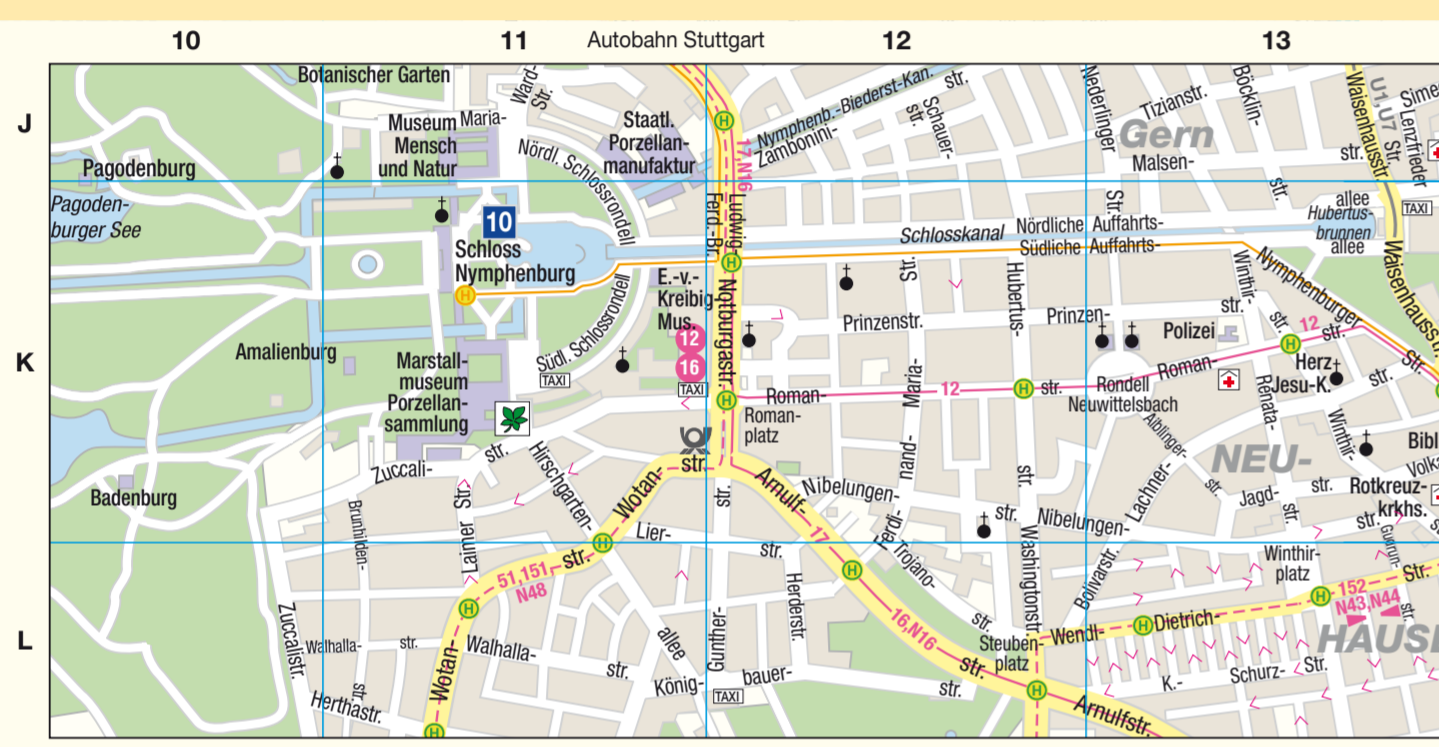
9 Deutsches Museum
 Technical achievements, experiments and much more can be found at the Deutsches Museum. It is one of the oldest museums in the world. It is a science and technology museum.

10 Nymphenburg Palace
 The summer residence of the Bavarian Electors is open to visitors. It boasts a number of important collections and a vast historical park with four smaller garden collections.

11 Olympic Park
 The sports area with Olympic mountain and lake was host to the 1972 Olympic Summer Games. It is a popular urban destination for recreation. The roof construction for the Olympic tower are world-renowned landmarks of Munich.

12 BMW Welt and Museum
 BMW Welt is the BMW adventure and delivery center. With its location near the parent plant it establishes a link between past and present achievements of this successful brand. The BMW Museum presents the historical roots and the current development of BMW.
